For Pentecost we often encourage people to wear red or bring red geraniums for the church flower beds. Some other ways to live out this theme would be by decorating the entrance with red banners, balloons or wind-chimes, hosting a red hot barbecue, serving red velvet cake, strawberries or distributing sparklers or mini-containers of bubble solutions. *(As you watch the bubbles ride the wind, shout out things the Holy Spirit is doing in your congregation or in the lives of your families.)*
